Historical Sketch: Evangelical Theological College was founded in 1924 in Dallas, TX and in 1936 the name was changed to Dallas Theological Seminary. The first president, Lewis Sperry Chafer had served as general secretary of Central American Missions. Women were not admitted to classes until 1975. Graduates of the seminary served in a variety of ministries, including foreign missions.

System of Arrangement: This collection is composed of one series, photographs. The photographs were basically left in the original order.

Scope and Content Note:

This collection mounted on 16 leaves and housed in one album box is composed of black and white photographs of Dallas Theological Seminary graduates who were serving in foreign missions. It is not known who assembled the album. Most of the photographs are snapshots, but a few were cut from publications. The fifteen missionaries pictured were active in Africa, Central America, South America, Europe, China, India, and the Caribbean.

Processing Information: The title of this collection is taken from the cover of the album. The original album had a wooden cover and acidic pages. Digital images of the pages were made before the album was disassembled. Photographs which were not glued to the pages were transferred to acid free pages with protective sleeves in an album box. Many of the original album pages had a brief description of an alumnus' ministry on one page followed by only one or two small photographs on the next page. To conserve space, the descriptions and photographs were sometimes placed on the same page of the new sheets. The new pages have the page numbers of the original album, so several pages have two numbers. Five leaves, pages 19 and

25-32, had photographs glued to them. These five leaves were left as is and placed in protective sleeves. The original pages were $11 \frac{3}{4}$ " W x 9" H. The new pages are 11" W x 10" H.

Separated Material: The wooden cover was placed in a polyethylene bag and stored separately. The original pages were also retained and stored with the cover.
